Walt Whitman, born in New York in 1819, was one of America's unusual literacy figures. As an individualist, he **rambled** through the country seeing people and places, and making them his own. His experiences in earning a living were varied; at time he was a printer, a teacher, a carpenter, a nurse and a newspaper editor. He was a big- hearted man, open and accepting. He gave freely his time to care for the wounded during the Civil War. Though he lived in the city, he often spent his time in the countryside, developing his strong sense of nature, which was carried through his poems. In 1835 he collected verses he had written, and published them in one volume, "Leaves of Grass", a book which he revised and rewrote all the rest of his life. The book was commented badly by some poets and generally ignored by others, probably because his verse forms were not traditional. Since then, Whitman style has greatly influenced modern poets.

The giant panda is internationally recognized as a symbol for conservation. It is the rarest member of the bear family and one of the world's most endangered mammals. Panda conservation activities are at its highest ever, but at the same time, the giant panda is facing its greatest challenge: fast economic development. Another danger to giant pandas is their limited choice of food - they only eat bamboo leaves.

The panda occurs only in China where it now lives in temperate mountain forests between 2,200 m and 3,400 m. Its range is reduced to half a dozen separate mountain ranges in western China on the eastern edge of the Tibetan plateau.
