Today, more and more Vietnamese women are actively participating in social activities both in urban and rural areas. In fact, they have been very successful in even many fields which used to be regarded as men's areas such as business, scientific research and social management. In some areas, women even show more overwhelming power than men. The image of Vietnamese women with creativeness, dynamism and success has become popular in Vietnam's society. It is said that the gender gap has been remarkably narrowed and women enjoy many more opportunities to pursue **their** social careers and contribute to the nation's socio-economic development. According to Ms, Le Thi Quy, Director of the Gender/and Development Research Centre, gender equality in Vietnam has reached a high level over the past decade. The rate of Vietnamese women becoming National Assembly members from the 9th term to the 11th term increased by 8.7%, bringing the percentage of Vietnamese women in authority to 27.3%, the highest rate in Southeast Asia. Besides, there is no big gap in the level of literacy and schooling between men and women. Women account for about 37% of university and college graduates, 19.9% of doctoral degree holders and 6.7% of professors and associate professors.

Mass media also highlights the continued success of women in every field and honors their great importance in modern society. Many projects on reproductive health care, children protection, and family income improvement jointly conducted by various mass organizations, state agencies and non-governmental organizations have created favorable conditions for women to become involved.

Women who Changed the World

Angela Burdett-Coutts was born on April 21st, 1814 in London, England. She was one of the richest women in England, but she gave all her time and energy to charity work and helping those in need.

Angela didn't just work with charities in Britain, she also supported organisations in Canada, Africa, Australia and the Middle East. Her social work included building houses for the poor and the homeless and building schools.

Angela Burdett-Coutts also played an important part in famous charities like the National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (NSPCC) and the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (RSPCA). Both charities still exist today. She received lots of awards from Queen Victoria for **her** charitable work.

Florence trained as a nurse and at age 33, she was running a hospital in London.
